



## Arthur L. Kellermann

### Education

Dr. Arthur Kellermann is the newly installed Dean of the F. Edward Hébert School of Medicine at the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USU); established by Congress in 1972 to provide a cadre of career military physicians and leaders for the Uniformed Services. He previously held the Paul O'Neill-Alcoa Chair in Policy Analysis at the RAND Corporation. Before joining RAND, he was a professor of emergency medicine and public health and associate dean for health policy at the Emory School of Medicine in Atlanta. Dr. Kellermann holds "excellence in science" awards from two organizations: the Society for Academic Emergency Medicine and the Injury Control and Emergency Health Services Section of the American Public Health Association. Elected to the Institute of Medicine (IOM) in 1999, he co-chaired the IOM Committee on the Consequences of Uninsurance and has served on IOM committees examining health promotion, emergency care, biosurveillance and other topics. He was recently elected to the Institute's Governing Council. A clinician and researcher, Kellermann practiced and taught for more than 25 years in public teaching hospitals in Seattle, Washington; Memphis, Tennessee; and Atlanta, Georgia.
