Dr. Kuperman is the IS Director for Population Health at NewYork-Presbyterian (NYP) and Adjunct Professor of Biomedical Informatics at Columbia University. Dr. Kuperman helps lead NYP's IS strategy for its various population health programs. He is NYP's IS lead on its \$80 million five-year Medicaid Delivery Systems Reform Incentive Payment (DSRIP) program, the goal of which is to reduce avoidable admissions and emergency room visits by 25% through improved interaction among NYP, non-acute providers and community-based organizations.

Dr. Kuperman has deep experience in health information exchange. In 2005, he was a founder of NYCLIX, Inc., a non-profit regional health information exchange organization (RHIO) in New York City. In 2012, NYCLIX merged with another similar organization to form Healthix, Inc., now the largest health information exchange organization in New York State.

Dr. Kuperman has carried out research on the design, development and implementation of clinical information systems and has evaluated their impact on quality and safety. He has been an author on 97 peer-reviewed articles related to medical informatics and lead author on 25 of those.

Dr. Kuperman is active in the American Medical Informatics Association (AMIA), the 5000-member professional home for informatics professionals. He was Chair of the AMIA Board of Directors from 2012-2013.
